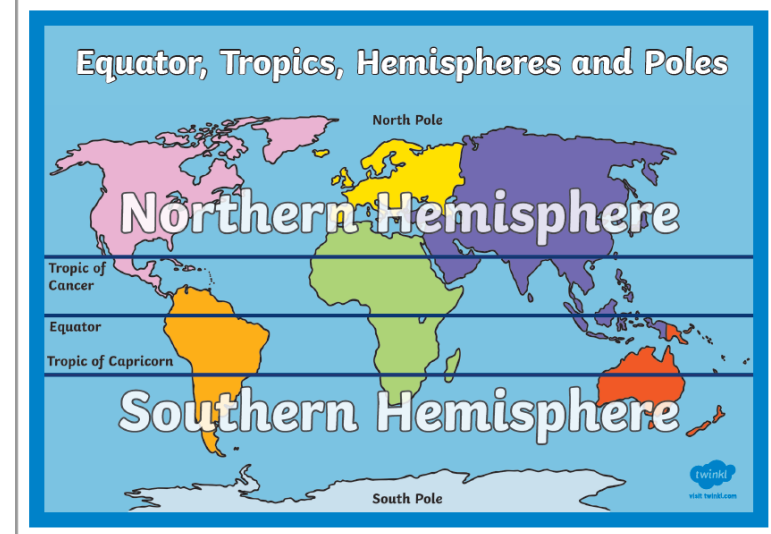
Average Temperature: 17.7°C

Iceland



Iceland is an island near the Arctic circle, in the North Atlantic Ocean. It has the smallest [population](#) in Europe.

The climate of Iceland is **subarctic**. In winter, the temperature in Iceland goes from 0°C to -10°C. Water turns to ice at 0°C, so you can imagine how cold it is in an Icelandic winter! In summer, the temperatures are usually 10°C to 15°C, although Iceland sometimes has much warmer summers.

In winter, there are usually only five hours of daylight in Iceland, yet in the summer there are only three hours of darkness!



The Aurora Borealis (also called the Northern Lights) can be seen in Iceland.
