



Charging and Remissions

The Governing Board of the School are responsible for determining the content of this policy and the Head Teacher for its implementation. Any determinations with respect to individual parents will be considered by the Head Teacher.

The aim of this policy is to set out what charges will be levied for activities, what remissions will be implemented and the circumstances under which voluntary contributions will be requested from parents.

At Chase View Primary School we believe that all our pupils should have an equal opportunity to benefit from school activities and visits (curriculum and extra-curricular) independent of their parents' financial means.

Education during school hours

All education during school hours is free. We do not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the National Curriculum.

Swimming Lessons

The school organises swimming lessons for children in Year 3. These take place in school time and are part of the National Curriculum. We make no charge for the swimming lessons.

Music

All children study music as part of the normal school curriculum and we do not charge for this.

Activities not run by the school

Chase View offers additional extra-curricular activities such as clubs after school. These may be run by qualified coaches, or other providers, who are not members of the school staff. Again, this is free of charge for all of the children that want to take part.

Breakfast Club

To ensure the provision of a high quality, safe and stimulating service a small fee of 30p is to be charged. However, no payment doesn't mean children are turned away as we have gained a unique sponsorship deal with Magic Breakfast providing unlimited Bagels from Bagel Nash.
