Why do Muslims have special times of the year to celebrate their faith?

- Ramadan: A Muslim festival where Muslims fast during the daylight and only eat after the sun has set.
- Eid-al-Fitr: Eid Al-Fitr means 'the feast of breaking the fast'. Eid Al-Fitr is a celebration that happens when Ramadan ends.
- Eid-al-Adha: Eid Al-Adha is an Islamic festival celebrated each year by Muslims. It is also known as the Greater Eid or the Festival of Sacrifice. This is because of a special story about loyalty, obedience and sacrifice.
