

Mountain	A part of the land that rises up above everything else.	Volcanic mountain	A mountain formed around the vents of volcanoes. Made from cooled ash and lava.
Mountain range	The collection or group of mountains joined up together.	Fault block mountain	A type of mountain created when cracks in the Earth's surface open up and great chunks of rock are pushed up.
Fold Mountain	A type of mountain created when tec- tonic plates collide.	Dome mountain	A type of mountain that is smooth and round looking. It is formed when mag- ma gets pushed up but doesn't ever flow out.
Tectonic plate	The giant plates that make up the crust of the earth's surface and move about.	Peak / Summit	The highest point of a mountain or hill.
Collide	When two things crash together, or bump against each other.	Face	The visible side of the mountain.
Base	The bottom of a mountain where it meets flat ground.	Plateau	A flat part of land high up the moun- tain.
Ridge	Long, narrow top connecting moun- tains.	Snow line	Above this line, snow covers the moun- tain all year.
Tree line	After this point, trees cannot grow.	Slope	An incline or decline on the side of a mountain
